We have had parents asking recently about their child's attendance. Two doses of the MMR vaccination can offer protection from measles for life, so it is really important to make sure that you and your loved ones have received it, to protect yourself and others.

Easter Hazards

What do grapes and mini eggs have in common?



Parents are being warned to remain vigilant this Easter over the dangers of Mini Eggs, which are sized equally to grapes and can pose a choking hazard for small children. Please ensure you monitor your child when they are eating mini eggs.

We will always advise parents to slice grapes into quarters to ensure easy and safe swallowing. When children are given grapes whole or mini eggs whole, they can become lodged and stop air passing into the lungs. This can cause a serious choking hazard. Look out for coughing, a difficulty breathing, signs of distress, grasping the throat and neck and lips turning blue.



What to do if a child is choking...

Ask them if they are choking and listen/look for signs and symptoms of choking.



Lean the child forward and ask them to cough to see if they can dislodge the object.



Lean the child over and complete 5 back slaps - you will need to hit hard to dislodge.



Complete 5 abdominal thrusts by putting your hands underneath the breast bone, and pull back and up.

If there is nobody with you to help, phone an ambulance immediately.



Repeat the slaps and thrusts in 5's until the ambulance arrives or the items are clear.

Always seek medical attention if choking has occurred.
