Pitch Assembly and incentives—what we do

Each week we hold our **Pitch Assembly**. Classes have one minute to pitch why they are the best class in school. Children choose what to present in the assembly and confidently share their learning. We regularly share learning through music, drama, physical education and other subjects. A big focus for this assembly is on developing long term memory by sharing key vocabulary and building speaking and

listening skills.

Children, who have been chosen for **individual awards** from each class, are celebrated within the Pitch Assembly. Each winning child is presented with a coloured T-shirt to wear with pride. We then praise children around school wearing their t-shirts throughout the week. The song Heroes is played around the building on Friday and children share their achievements with leaders as they receive recognition and



treats for their achievements. **Reading Heroes** chosen based on attitudes to reading, reading at home or continued effort with reading. They receive a badge, book mark and get to wear a yellow T-shirt celebrating them as 'Reader of the Week.' **Attendance Heroes** can be chosen for a variety of reasons, for good or improved attendance, being in school on time and being a good role model to others. They wear the green t-shirts and enjoy a milkshake and receive a sticker, pencil and certificate. For excellent learning children are chosen to wear the blue T-shirt which says **I have received an award for my work**. They share their learning with Mrs Cooke or Mrs Hemmingway and receive a pen or a pencil and a sticker. Each child will also visit our book collection to choose a book of interest to keep.

Our final coloured t-shirts are purple and are awarded to children displaying consistent **Ready**, **Respectful, Safe** behaviours. As a group the children enjoy a hot chocolate with Mrs Cooke or Mrs Hemmingway and are praised for being positive role models to others.

We are very proud of our children who continue to shine each week. Look out in the coming weeks as we will be giving parents an opportunity to come and watch a pitch assembly and see the great learning in school. This week we are going to introduce live voting in the Year 4,5 and 6 assembly for the best class of the week - we can't wait to see the results!
