I quickly noticed how polite and courteous the children were. The area was busy with people leaving the station, and as you would expect all were in a hurry to get to their destinations. Marshalled by your adult staff the children patiently and politely allowed adults through, they then quietly and in an organised manner continued on their journey.

Mrs Cooke I simply felt that I should comment on how impressed I was with the manner in which children from your school conducted themselves, particularly around a busy town centre location. In a disciplined manner they quietly walked on the footpaths to one side allowing members of the public to pass.
