Attendance

Whole School Attendance – 95.3% Highest House - Tornado Red - 96.6%

Please ensure that your child is in school on time ready for the start of the school day. Gates open at 8.35am, with classroom doors opening at 8.40am and closing at 8.50am - your child will then be asked to enter school through the main office doors so that teaching can commence in the classroom. Children who are persistently late into school , will receive an Early Bird phone call from the Attendance team at 8.00am to ensure children are awake and will be in school on time.





Ray does a fantastic job in a morning and afternoon to ensure that our children are crossing safely. He does this in all weath-

ers. Please make sure that, no matter what the weather, you are crossing the road with Ray. It would be upsetting if a child was hurt because they have not crossed with him in the rain.

Please think safety first.

Medication in school

If your child requires medication during the school day, this must be handed into the Main Office before school and should be collected at the end of the day. A form must be completed on the first day it is to be administered and we can only administer prescribed medication that is 4 times per day.

Safeguarding

Have you left an abusive relationship?

The Doncaster Survivor Liaison Service runs weekly groups in the community and online for survivors of domestic abuse.

The Survivor Liaison Service is a service for survivors who are no longer with the person who harmed them or has any ongoing criminal justice system action and those who are not working with another domestic abuse professional. We can provide ongoing emotion support after abuse and support for those who may be navigating the Family Courts

The peer-led support groups aim to bring survivors with lived experience of domestic abuse together to help inspire and empower each other in living a safe life free from abuse. Groups are available for women only, men only and members of the LGBTQ+community. Peer one-to-one support is also available through the Survivor Liaison Service.
