Sandford Road Roadworks

As you will be aware, construction work on the Sandford Road Active Travel Scheme has been underway since the Summer months. This is progressing well and will soon move on to the next phase, with the road closure on the Southbound lane to re-open on Friday 16th February. Work on the Northbound lane will begin on Monday 19th February 2024 - our first day back after half term.

This next phase will include; reducing the width of the central island between Woodfield Road and Weston Road to make room for the new cycle lane, resurfacing of the carriageway along the full length of the road and upgrading street lighting and traffic signals.

To undertake the phase of works safely and efficiently there will be a closure of the Northbound lane of Sandford Road between Weston Road and Balby Road. However the section between Woodfield Road and Balby Road will be open for access, including turning points until the resurfacing is complete. Whilst the road closure is in place, diversions will be along Balby Road and Tickhill Road.

The road closure is in place from Monday 19th February for approximately 6-8 weeks (weather dependent) and will affect transporting your child to school. Please ensure you allow extra time for travelling to school so that your child is on time. We have many families and staff that travel to school from this direction and the road works need to be taken into account for your child's arrival time. The school gate closes at 8:50am and any child who arrives after this time will be marked as late, including if they travel from this area.



Keep yourself safe in a fire...

This week, Miss Allison and Miss Parker took part in Safer South Yorkshire training where they learnt about minimising risks of fires in homes. Some of the things you could think about in your home to minimise the risk of a fire starting is:

- Checking your smoke alarms are working at least once a week
- Not smoking indoors
- Disposing of cigarettes correctly or emptying overflowing ash trays
- Not smoking E-Cigarettes indoors
- Not leaving lit candles unattended
- Not overloading plug sockets or extension cables
- Cleaning your kitchen regularly because a build-up of fat or grease could cause a fire
- Not leaving appliances running unattended or overnight such as dishwasher/washing machine/tumble dryer
- Don't leave your phone or any devices charging overnight
- Avoid deep oil cooking

Did you know?

There's 2 accidental fires a day due to unattended candles.

Every 6 days someone in the UK dies from a fire caused by a cigarette.

Just two breaths of lung inhalation can kill an adult.

If a fire is caused by hot oil do not pour water on it.

Get out.
Stay out.
Call 999.



Other Risks to look out for

- No working **smoke alarms**
- Blocked or cluttered **exit routes**
- **Unable to open** windows and doors
- **Missing or poorly fitted** internal doors
- **Unable to make themselves safe** or **appropriately respond** to alarm activation
- **Unable to call 999** or alert the **emergency services**

Electrical

- **Overloading** sockets
- **Worn, damaged or poorly** repaired leads and equipment
- Plugs & sockets **scorched** and/or feeling warm
- **Unsafe charging** of electrical equipment
- Plug in air fresheners ▶
- Electricals not to British Standards
