Assemblies

Our British Values Assembly focus this week was - British litter-pickers have become world champions in the SpoGomi World Cup after sifting through nearly 60 kilograms of rubbish in Tokyo, Japan, for the first-ever contest of its kind.

What we have done in school to support this...

We have set up a Litter-Picking Squad who can help with keeping the school and playground free of litter. Their first job will be to look at what are the main items they find – school litter or litter that has blown in from the street. The children will walk around the perimeter of school with Mr Hood and Mrs Cooke, to discuss their ideas about reducing litter. Year 5 and 6 will apply first to then help Year 3 and 4 too.

Safety Squad

The new year 5 and 6 Safety Squad met last week to discuss ideas on how to keep children in school safe. The squad are going to be working across school and in the playground helping and teaching children about elements of safety and safeguarding. This term we are looking at 'banter', what it is and how it can impact children.
