Wild about Sleep!



We have just launched our new Wild about Sleep initiative in school, an exciting opportunity for families with children who have experienced sleep issues to join with The Sleep Charity and Doncaster Forest School to explore new ways to support their children with good sleep routines and find out the benefits outdoor activity can have on sleep. Forest school and being outdoors in nature has proven benefits to sleep and wellbeing and this experience-building process will offer children and

families the opportunity to achieve and develop confidence through hands-on learning in a woodland or outdoor environment. The experiences will include den building, shelter erecting, fire

lighting, cooking, using tools such as bow saws, peelers and knives, investigating natural woodland, making mud pies and so much more!

The Sleep Charity advocates 'Quality sleep is essential for children's growth and development. A decent night's sleep will help them to do better at school, allow them to react more quickly to situations, have a more developed memory, learn more effectively and solve problems, plus it will make them less susceptible to colds and other minor ailments, less irritable and better behaved!'. We will be launching a Sleep Week initiative in a few weeks encouraging children to record how they feel and how much sleep they get in a week as part of our well-being work.
